EARLI is delighted to announce a new pilot bursary scheme for JURE members. The scheme is intended to provide successful applicants with funding to cover activities and items needed to develop research opportunities amongst JURE members. We hope that these contributions will provide additional support to JURE research, boost the quality of the research as well as further develop research culture broadly within EARLI. We would strongly welcome collaborative projects amongst JURE members or activities that would showcase EARLI to new potential members.

You may apply for a bursary to fund any of the following items and activities:

- Workshop travel (excluding conferences such as JURE, SIG, EARLI)
- Training
- Books
- Data collection costs (e.g., travel/ vouchers but not data collection equipment)
- Costs needed for student-led events that aim to increase research culture (e.g., coffee and biscuits for writing group, room cost for knowledge exchange event)

Items not covered by this scheme:

- Tuition fees
- Maintenance costs
- Laptops for general study use
- Research assistant costs

To be eligible to apply, you must:

- have been a JURE member for the last 2 years (incl. 2024)
- demonstrate that you have attempted to identify other funding options (which were either not available or applications to them were unsuccessful) before making this application;
- Showcase wider benefit for EARLI to invest in this activity.

Complete and submit the application form, explaining your rationale for applying for the bursary including the amount needed. Please note that the bursary is limited to € 1.000 per successful applicant.

The deadline for submission is **14th of May 2024**. Applications will be reviewed by late May 2024 and successful applicants will be notified by early June 2024. If you have any questions, you are welcome to email info@earli.org.

Successful applicants will be required to email a 500-word summary about the activities and outcomes that have resulted from the bursary.
